The Diocese of Utah is a small diocese. The clergy in charge of congregations have been involved in a study and process to heighten their awareness of their own implicit bias and the ways that this bias has shaped their own lives. The Diocese also took on an effort locally in some of the congregations as well as an all diocese opportunity to participate in the Sacred Ground Curriculum. From this, there is a desire too move forward in holding events large and small to provide opportunities for more people of the diocese to participate in racial reconciliation activities. Some congregations have continued to move forward in their work by establishing groups to work on the development of Beloved Community in their congregation. The most recent hire on Diocesan Staff is Latino. But, that was not done by design. Rather, she was seen as the most qualified person. We are also blessed to have Forrest Cuch who has presented to the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church as well as congregations on the experience and history of First Nation people in Utah. The Peace and Justice Committee is being re-established with two foci - Racial Reconciliation and Care of Creation.
